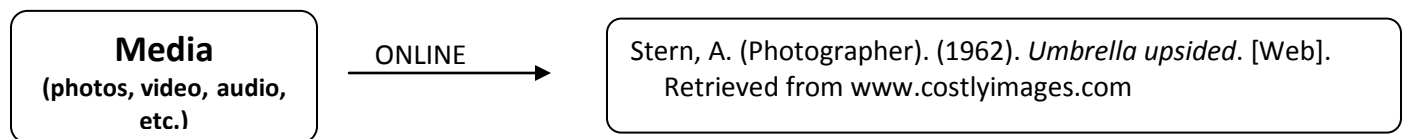
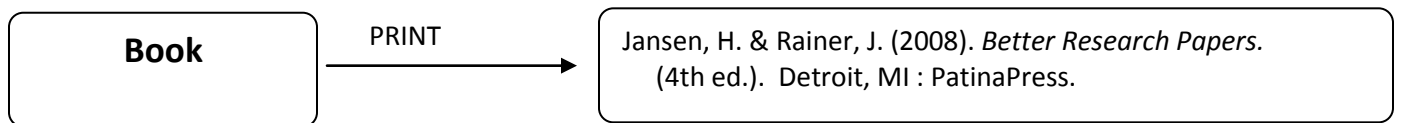
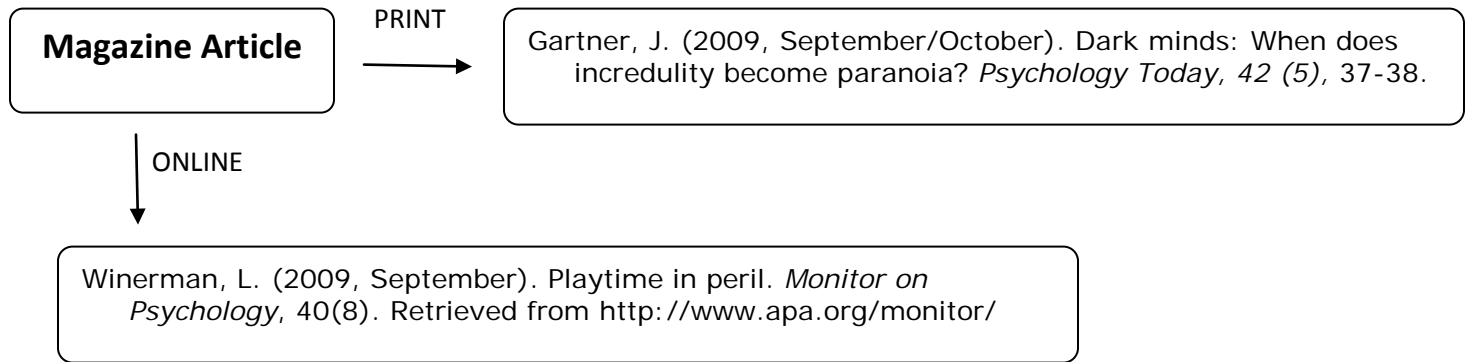
- Use the **DOI** when available (**digital object identifier** - unique alphanumeric string usually found on the 1st page of a journal article- example: doi:10.1108/03090560710821161.
- If there is no DOI, use the **URL (web address)**.
- Only include **retrieval dates** for blogs, wikis, and podcasts.
- Include object type in brackets for [images], [videos], [audio], [podcasts], [blogs], and [wikis].
- If there is **more than one author**, list them in the order they are listed in the book, article, etc.

Peer-reviewed journals contain original research in the field. There is usually an "abstract" (a kind of summary) at the beginning, a bibliography at the end, and content is written by professionals in the field (researchers, doctors, lawyers etc.)



Newspaper or Magazine articles contain current event or general interest items. Articles are shorter, non-technical, and are usually written by journalists.
