

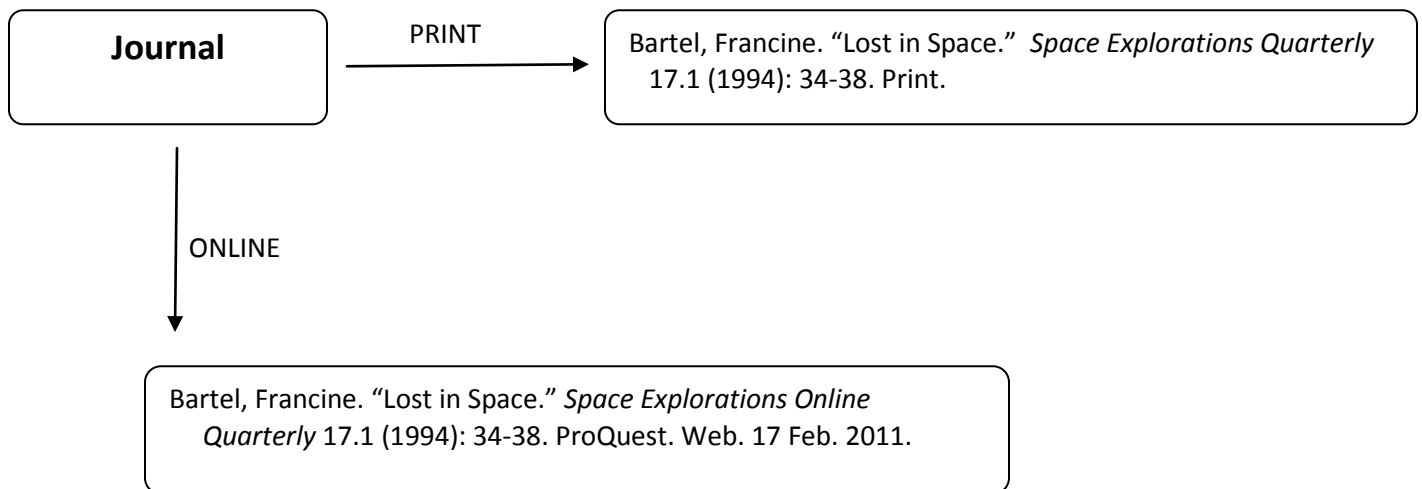
# MLA Chart based on 7th ed.

Double Space all entries and list in alphabetical order by the author's last name. For each source you use, look for the minimum information to create your citation- author, title, and publication information. When entries continue to another line, indent the second line by five spaces.

-If you can't find a publisher or publishing date use n.p. or n.d. respectively.

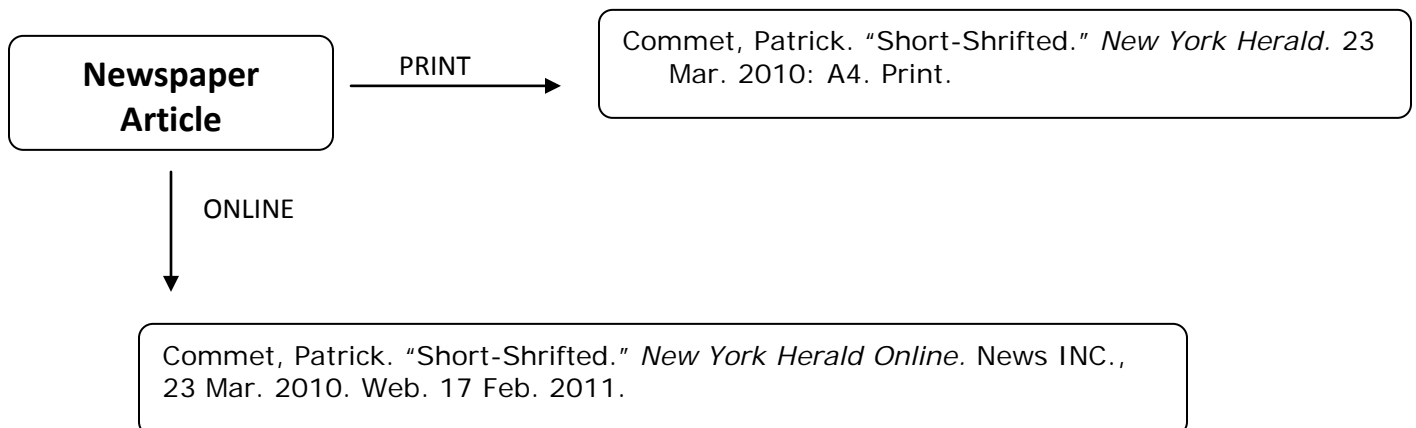
-If there is **more than one author**, list them in the order they are listed in the book, article, etc.

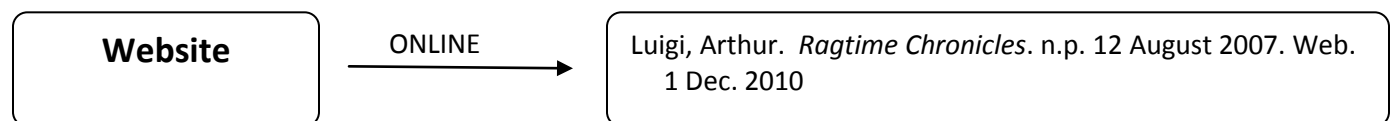
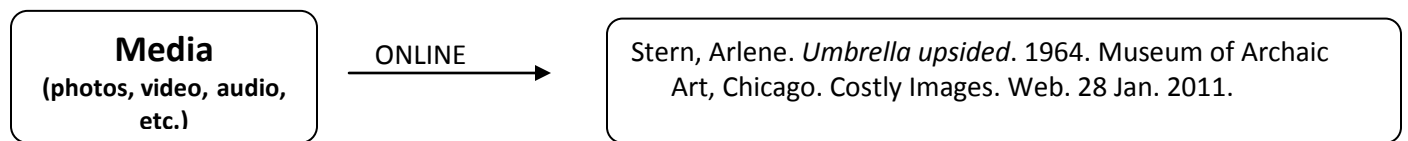
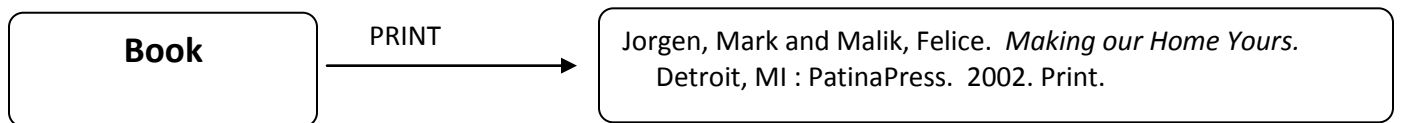
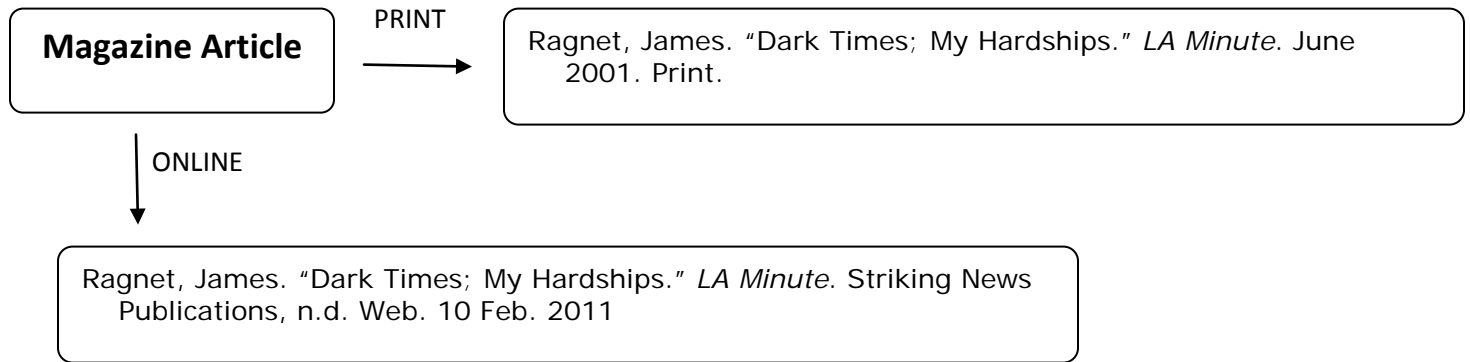
**Peer-reviewed journals** contain original research in the field. There is usually an "abstract" (a kind of summary) at the beginning, a bibliography at the end, and content is written by professionals in the field (researchers, doctors, lawyers etc.)



**Newspaper or Magazine articles** contain current event or general interest items.

Articles are shorter, non-technical, and are usually written by journalists.
